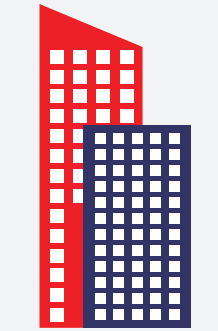

of students believe Ontario citizens should be prepared to sacrifice and deal with program and public service cuts to help solve the deficit;

65%
of students would be in favour of increasing Corporate Taxes to raise government revenue.

81%
of students believe the Ontario government should increase “sin” taxes on alcohol, tobacco and gambling.



83% of students are concerned about Ontario’s fiscal situation and the impact it could have on their future.



66% of students chose health care when asked to choose which of the seven major government sectors should remain a spending priority; only 23% of students chose education.

55% of students think the government should only use some of Drummond’s recommendations and supplement any rejected advice with their own ideas.

53% of students agree with the government’s decision cut costs instead of raising taxes to solve the deficit problem;

34% think the government should both cut costs and raise revenue.

STUDENTS
rejected all Drummond recommendations that could negatively impact the health and education sectors:

63% reject class size increases

60% reject the cancellation of the 30% tuition grant

59% reject removing a fifth year of high school for graduates

60% reject capping annual health care spending increases at 2.5%

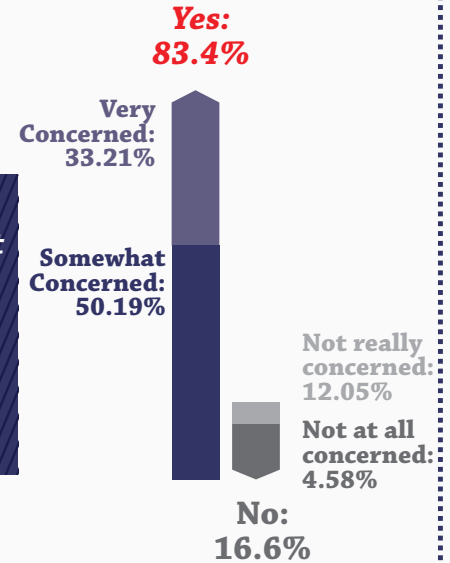

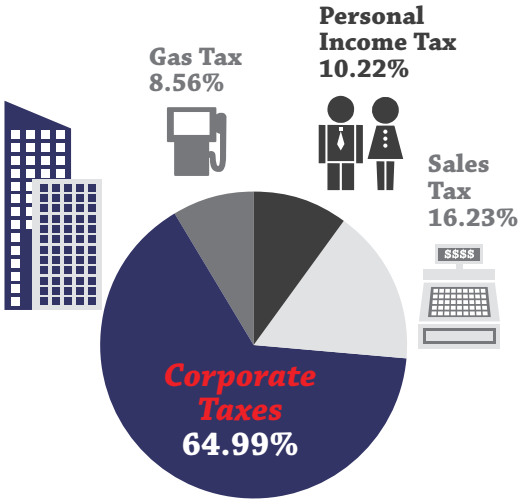
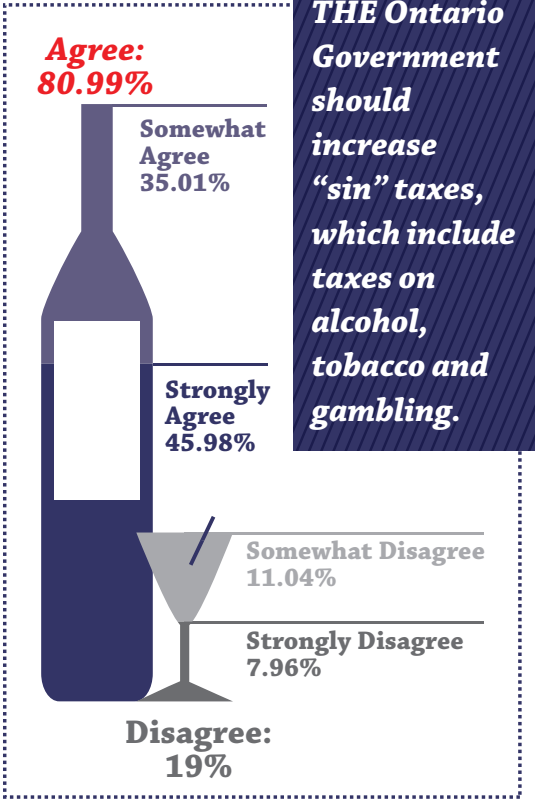

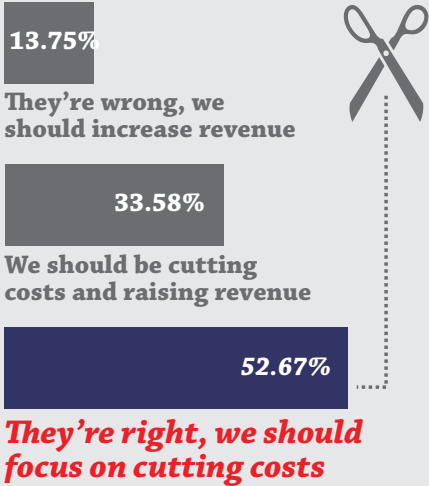
Revenue **STUDENTS WANT SPENDING CUTS,

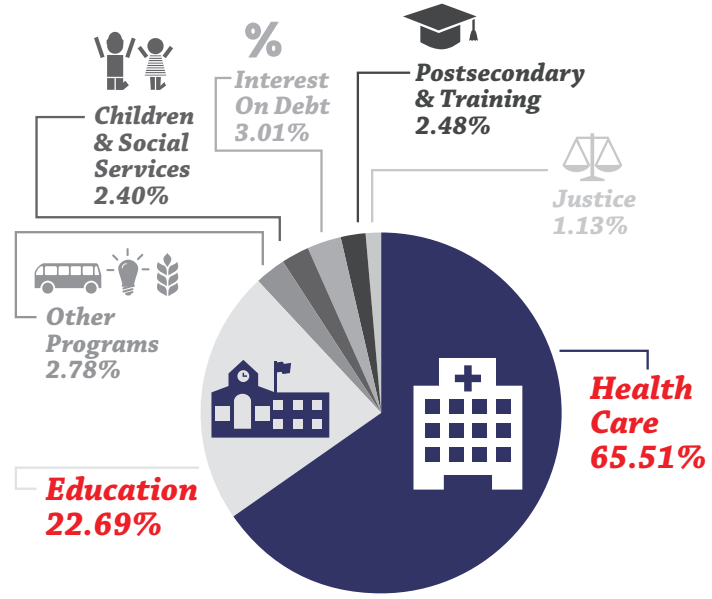

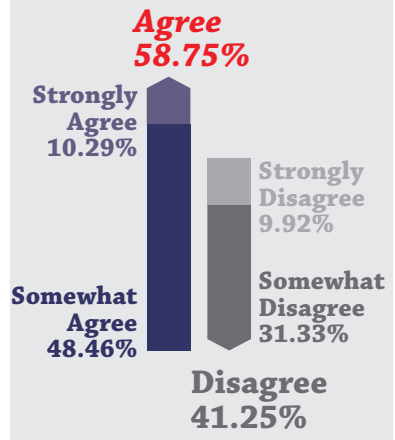

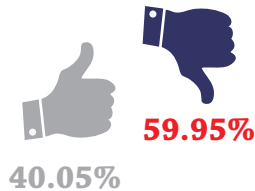

THE Government of Ontario should consider canceling the 30% Ontario tuition grant received by most Ontario post-secondary students and focus on providing more assistance to low-income students instead.



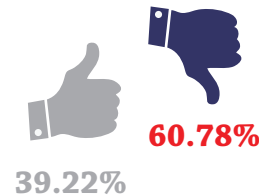

THE Government of Ontario should limit health-care spending increases, which have averaged 6.3% annually for the past five years, to 2.5%.



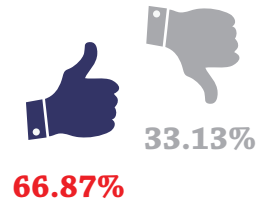

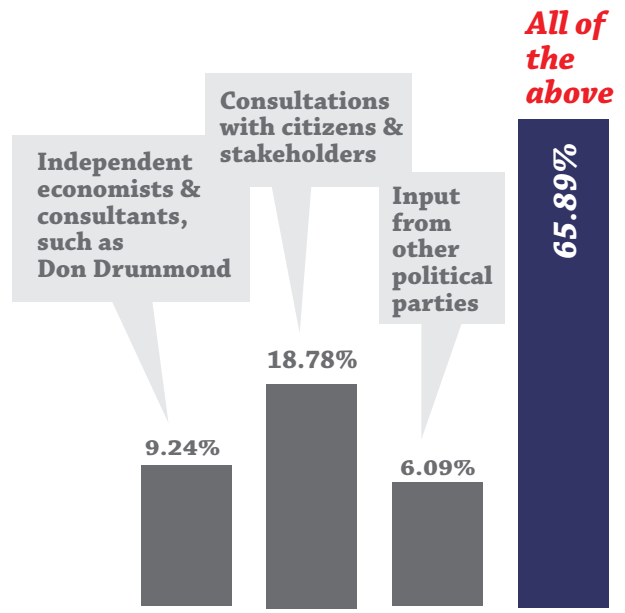
THE Government of Ontario should stop allowing secondary school students to return for a fifth year of school if they have completed 32 or more credits; students would need to pay if they wished to remain in school.

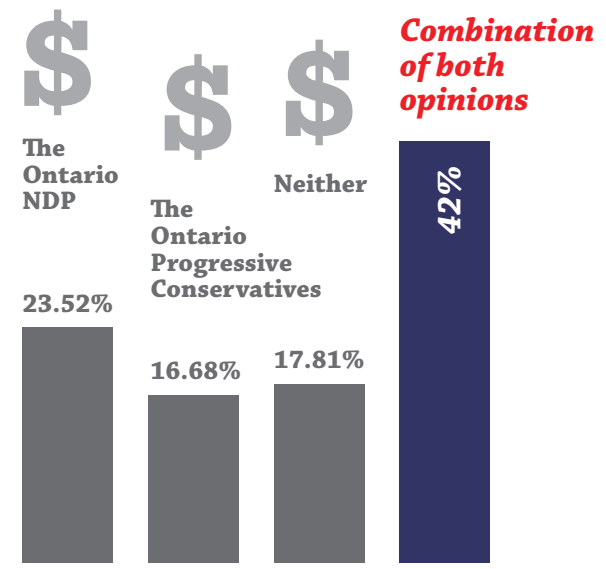
